STATEMENT OF WORK

HAZARDOUS MATERIALS CONTROL AND MANAGEMENT NAVAL FACILITIES ENGINEERING COMMAND, WASHINGTON

Title: HSMS Expert

OBJECTIVE

The objective of this contract is to provide the US Marine Corps (USMC) Base, Quantico, with an on-site Hazardous Substance Management System (HSMS) expert.

BACKGROUND

On 29 May, 1997, Headquarters Marine Corps published Marine Corps Bulletin 4440, *Hazardous Materials Consolidation Program*, which states "it is U.S. Marine Corps Policy that commands/installations/activities shall control and manage hazardous materials (HM) using methods that minimize the types and quantities of HM procured, stored, distributed, and used to accomplish mission requirements."

The United States Marine Corps (USMC) Hazardous Material Consolidation Program (HCP) supports enhanced control and management of HM and minimizes the generation of hazardous waste (HW) associated with HM usage. HCP consists of eight generic attributes, including the following: Centralized HM management; Authorized Use List (AUL); Inventory management; Order/dispense procedures; Reuse/reissue procedures; Centralized issue/storage points; Tracking system; and Training/awareness program. Specific tasks to reach these goals are outlined in section 5.0.

In support of Department of Defense initiatives, the contractor will provide Hazardous Substance Management System (HSMS)/Regional Hazardous Inventory Control System (RHICS) implementation and system maintenance support to Marine Corps Base Quantico (MCB Quantico). MCB Quantico has approximately 318 work centers including tenant activities, of which approximately 190 are authorized users in this management system. Only 80 of these work centers actively submit their inventories (these are the major work centers). MCB Quantico does not have basewide participation, however. 110 of these centers are smaller and need to be encouraged by the contractor to actively participate in the management system.

SCOPE

Using government furnished hardware and software, the contractor shall provide support for the base period and option periods as determined by the government to serve as HM Program Manager. The contractor will provide HSMS/RHICS system maintenance to MCB Quantico in support of the

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following areas:

On-site support. The contractor will provide an on-site expert to provide on-site support to perform the work listed in section 5. Optional effort is delineated in section 8. Management and oversight of the project will also be provided by the contractor.

Material Inventory and Data Entry. Inventories and data entry as required to support specific taskings delineated in section 5. The shops will provide the data to the contractor. The contractor shall input the data into the database. At present, shops are unable to directly input data themselves. The shops will provide the data to the contractor in paper form.

Training. The contractor shall be responsible for maintaining an expertise in hazardous materials control and management. Training will be in the nature of on-the-job training, as opportunities arise during the execution of the work. If specific formal training is directed by the government, the government will reimburse associated expenses to the contractor to include cost of tuition, travel expenses, and hourly billing.

EDUCATION, EXPERIENCE, AND SKILLS

The contractor will be familiar with inventory management procedures, with hazardous materials (HM) storage principles, and with hazardous materials information resources (HMIRS), Federal Logistics (FEDLOG), Crystal Reports, HSMS, and RHICS.

The contractor will also be familiar with Oracle 8.0, Windows Server 2000, Microsoft Internet Information Services 6.0, Microsoft FrontPage, and Crystal Enterprise 8.5.

SPECIFIC CONTRACTOR DUTIES

Development of various data entry policies to protect the integrity of the oracle database

Issuance and maintenance of system passwords with AULs

Management of user access privileges

Development of ad-hoc reports using Crystal Reports for compliance purposes

Production of HSMS and ad-hoc reports.

Management of Engineering Change Proposals (changing a work practice) for MCB Quantico. The contractor will provide input to changes in work practices (for instance, by suggesting less toxic chemicals) to support the objective of pollution prevention.

Conduct repairs to bad data in the database.

Troubleshoot HSMS (Oracle) software problems.

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Maintenance of database quality assurance

Input of HSMS data monthly to support virtual pharmacy

Management of the HSMS database server to include but not limited to server backup, software updates, and providing assistance to the system administrator in troubleshooting hardware and network problems associated with HSMS.

Providing assistance to the system administrator in troubleshooting network problems associated with the HMMP IIS server.

Extracting useful data from the HSMS database to assist MCB Quantico to comply with local, state, and federal reporting requirements.

Management of pre-existing MCB Quantico intranet website

Refinement of database, website, and business practices to further facilitate customer support and virtual pharmacy efforts

Customer assistance to work centers including MSDS research and acquisition, generating HSMS/RHICS barcodes for material inventory, modifying AULs, and updating inventory data in the HSMS database. MSDS sheets should be scanned, and input into the management system by contractor.

PLACE OF PERFORMANCE

The contractor will be working at the US Marine Corps Base in Quantico Virginia.

LABOR HOURS AND PERIOD OF PERFORMANCE

The contractor shall provide full-time onsite support for the base year (from notice to proceed until September 30, 2008) and four 1 year option periods, if the options are exercised.

OPTIONAL CONTRACTOR DUTIES

The following options may be required of the contractor, depending on availability of funding:

Option 1. Hazardous Materials Inspection support. Depending on availability of funding, the contractor will provide Hazardous Materials inspection support for a base wide survey and inventory, for the base period and option periods, level of effort as determined by the government. The purpose of this optional task is to document the work centers participation in the management system to focus future outreach and training goals. This work shall include but not be limited to the following:

Material inventory.

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Material Safety Data Sheet (MSDS) research and acquisition.

Barcoding of material using the HSMS/RHICS software and barcode equipment.

Entry of relevant inventory data into the HSMS database.

Audit of work center's inventory (such as cycle counting and other functions)

Option 2. IT support and web development. Depending on availability of funding, the contractor will provide various IT support and web development services, for the base period and option periods, level of effort as determined by the government. This work shall include but not be limited to the following:

- Redesign the HMMP web site.
- Improve on the HMMP web functionality
- Maintain the HMMP web as needed
- Oracle development support as needed

ADDITIONAL REQUIREMENTS AND AGREEMENTS

Engineer in Charge (EIC) and Contracting Officer

Only the EIC and the Contracting Officer are authorized to explain or clarify the requirements of this scope of work.

Liability

The contractor shall assume all risk and shall be liable for any damages to persons or property in connection with the accomplishment under this scope of work.

Progress Payments

The Government shall only approve invoices for progress payments that reflect the percentage of the tasks completed. This percentage shall be submitted by the contractor and evaluated by the EIC. It shall be the contractor's responsibility to furnish the Government with the appropriate documentation for invoice justification.

Working Hours

Field Working hours shall be from Monday through Friday 0700HRS – 1700HRS, unless otherwise approved by the contracting officer and facility personnel. No work shall be performed on weekends or Federal holidays without prior approval by the

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contracting officer, EIC and the Quantico POC.

Contract Number

The contract number for this project shall be used on all reports, invoices, and correspondence.

Releases

Copies of calculations, reports, or any laboratory analyses, etc., generated for the execution of this project shall become the property of the government and shall not be released to any other agency or individual without the prior approval of the Contracting Officer. All contact will be coordinated through the Contracting Officer.

List of individuals

The contractor shall provide the EIC a list of staff to be working on this project that includes their role in this project and their qualifications to assume that role.

Progress Reports

The contractor shall submit monthly written progress reports to the EIC describing work accomplished, problems encountered with proposed solutions; work projected for the following month, and overall projected schedule status.
